

**FACTS****WHAT DOES The First National Bank of Fort Smith DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?****Why?**

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

**What?**

The type of personal information we collect and share depends on the product or service you have with us. This information includes:

- Social Security Number and Account Transactions
- Account Balances and Payment History
- Income and Credit History

When you are *no longer* our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.

**How?**

All financial companies need to share **customer's** personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their **customer's** personal information; the reasons **The First National Bank of Fort Smith** chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

## What we do

### How does The First National Bank of Fort Smith protect my personal information?

To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

### How does The First National Bank of Fort Smith collect my personal information?

We collect your personal information, for example, when you

- Open an account or Apply for a loan.
- Make a wire transfer or Give us your contact information.
- Provide account information.

We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.

### Why can't I limit all Sharing?

Federal law gives you the right to limit only

- Sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes -- information about your creditworthiness.
- Affiliates from using your information to market to you.
- Sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you.

State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.

## Definitions

### Affiliates

Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies:

*First Bank Corp (Financial Holding Company) owns a controlling interest in the financial companies: The First National Bank of Fort Smith; Citizens Bank and Trust Company; Brown Hiller Clark Insurance Company of Arkansas; and Brown Hiller Clark Insurance Company of Oklahoma. First Bank Corp. also owns controlling interest in the nonfinancial company, Realty Appraisals Inc..*

### Nonaffiliates

Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *The First National Bank of Fort Smith does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.*

### Joint marketing

A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.

- *The First National Bank of Fort Smith does not Jointly Market.*
